You may have heard of "Virtual Youtuber" or "VTubers", but in this world these charming guys, gals, and others are more than just virtual avatars. This truly is a world where humans, fantasy creatures, indescribable monsters, or any number of human-animal hybrids, peacefully coexist.

Be aware that in spite of all the fantastic beings and forces at play, nobody seems capable or willing to abuse their power for great evil. Perhaps out of fear of retaliation, or maybe just out of politeness. Also, don't ask why they're still called "Virtual Youtubers" when only some of them are virtual. It's rude.

For some reason, live streaming of all kinds has exploded in popularity in this world as of late. You just recently started up your own channel, though by default there won't be any penalty for closing it early. Go on and flirt, socialize, laugh, cringe, cry, and above all else, have fun!

Your starting location depends on what would be most appropriate for your avatar's theme.

As you'd imagine, a world with so many diverse beings can get a bit chaotic. Just as there is sentient AI, there is a fully navigable cyberspace. Just as there are angels and demons, there is Heaven, Hell, and everything in-between. Alien worlds, parallel universes, modern cities, fantasy villages, etc.

If a VTuber's lore takes place there, some equivalent of it not only exists, but is physically accessible. Any given day could be spent with relatively mundane highschool hijinks, making friends with a slime-girl kaiju, or sitting down for a spot of tea with the princess of the nearby fantasy kingdom.

With that said, given what unifying force it is here, there are hardly any locations lacking the bare minimum technology or magitech for live-streaming, and access to several shared streaming or video hosting platforms.

Certain body types are more common than others. You can expect to come across far more humans or human-animal hybrids than any truly monstrous beasts or anthropomorphic objects, not to say those won't exist in some quantity.



Choose any age and gender for free. Any background can be taken as Drop-In.





Corpo VTuber: You were, or soon will be, picked up by a VTuber agency. You have less control over your activities, and punishments for slip-ups can be severe, but the additional visibility, resources, and manpower more than makes up for it. ¥0



Support VTuber: The spotlight isn't for everyone. You much prefer to help others from the sidelines, or let your creations speak for you. Whether you're a manager, clipper, artist, etc. it's thanks to you that these stars can shine their brightest. ¥0



Indie VTuber: Not every VTuber has the privilege of a big company behind them. You established yourself through your own efforts. It's harder to get your name out there but have much more freedom and are generally seen as more genuine. ¥o



Anti VTuber: You are a major source of toxicity in the community. Perhaps you're well-meaning but naturally antagonistic, maybe you're just a bully, maybe you defend some controversial opinions. Maybe you're just weird. For a little extra ¥ you start this jump with a well-documented track record of controversy. ¥o / +¥100



This is the theme and/or form you'll be assuming in this world.



Theme: You can freely choose your biology, lore, and aesthetics for this world. Whether you're a haunted doll, a catgirl, a chicken nugget, a necromancer, a summoned hero, a well-endowed Alien/Dragon/Robot hybrid from a faraway planet, a perfectly normal art student, or anything else. Be warned, this alone won't provide any special or unique powers, even if it logically should. ¥0

Dimensionality: In this world, "2D" VTubers are masters of limiting their body movement and making sure the camera always catches them at the optimal angle to accentuate their details and subtle body language. On the other hand "3D" VTubers instead specialize in physical comedy (or seduction) making their every movement more charming and expressive. You receive one of these two for free or may pay extra to have mastered both styles. ¥o / ¥100

Mommy? Sorry!: A recently developed artform that greatly contributed to the explosion in streaming culture. Relative to the amount of attention you attract, you gradually accumulate a kind of psychic energy that certain artists can shape into new accessories or modifications for your avatar, or even entirely new models. You can summon and switch between these at will. You can pay extra ¥ to upgrade this perk to allow you to use your own artistic skills to use these techniques on yourself. All other purchases in this section impact the range of what you can receive or create through this. ¥o / ¥200



BGM: At will, you can trigger an infinite playlist of generic but copyright-proof background music to play with no apparent source. For an extra charge this BGM is completely unique and perfectly tailored to your tastes and aesthetics.  $\frac{1}{2}$ 0

Consistency: At no cost, you are able to re-skin any special abilities from outside this world to better match your avatar's aesthetic. For an extra charge, you can freely decide a new aesthetic for this at the start of each jump.  $\frac{1}{2}$ 0 /  $\frac{1}{2}$ 50

Jumper is Boing Boing: You are able to freely decide the proportions of your Avatar, within the realm of plausibility for whatever you are. For an extra  $\$_{50}$ , all bets are off. You can have breasts that should break your spine or thighs thicker than the rest of your entire body. No matter how debilitating they should be, these exaggerated features are hardly even an inconvenience in daily life.  $\$_{0}$  /  $\$_{50}$ 

Background: Attached to your warehouse or a property of your choosing is a streaming room matching your avatar's aesthetics that can display your chat in real time. For an extra \$50, you can decide on a new aesthetic each jump, or reskin your entire warehouse to match this aesthetic, or \$100 for both. \$0 / \$50 / \$100

Art Style: The diversity of forms in this world stretches beyond physiology. Many VTubers have a distinct art style that fundamentally clashes with reality around them. Like resembling a messy sketch or cell shading. Similarly, you may give your avatars distinct art styles.  $Y_{50}$ 

Jiggle Physics: By taking this, you have "sliders" controlling the degree that physics impacts the various parts of your body or attire. You can bring it all the way down to paralyze those parts of your body, or all the way up to make them dart around the room at the slightest nudge. This can't be used on large parts of your body like your limbs. ¥50

Lore: Many VTubers have fantastic abilities (on paper). This is something small, like superhuman strength or psychic powers. For double the price, you could be something like a multiversal monarch or guardian of a primordial force. However, you will find it fundamentally impossible to use these for anything more than mundane gags or small aesthetic effects. ¥50 / ¥100

Scale: Make two purchases here to decide the upper and lower bounds of how large or small your avatars can be. You receive an extra \(\frac{4}{200}\) for every level your smallest size is above Average, or every level your largest size is below Average.

- Microscopic: Mouse microbe. ¥100
- Small: Human child mouse. ¥50
- Average: Human height range. ¥o
- Big: Freakishly tall human elephant. ¥100
- Colossal: Elephant skyscraper. ¥200

Miscellaneous skills and abilities that may help you along.

Poggers!: Nobody will call you out-of-touch ever again. You have an intuitive ability to always be able to understand and utilize even the most nonsensical modern slang, even before anyone's had a chance to explain them to you. ¥0

Voice Changer: You have a voice that's either iconically distinct or broadly appealing. For a plus charge your vocal range is absurd, able to go from prepubescent girl to grown man in an instant. You can keep these up for extended periods and nobody is ever sure which is your real voice.  $\frac{1}{20}$ 

Hot Tub Streamer: You are now able to enjoy the comfort of a hot tub/spring regardless of your current physiology or attire. Even electronics on your person would be perfectly fine. You also don't look half bad in a swimsuit.¥50

For Free?: Choose a particular body part or trait. Yours is not only a prime example of this feature, but you can awaken an ambiguously ironic obsession with this trait in people who would otherwise be ambivalent.  $Y_{50}$ 

Big Dick Energy: This is... something. You'll find that your actual gender has little effect on your ability to project conventional masculinity or femininity. Also, if you claim to have a dick when you clearly don't, people will usually play along, if not believe you outright. Doesn't actually give you a dick. ¥50

Basic Skills: Not just everyone can make it big in the VTubing scene. The below specialties are \$100 each, though the first three purchases are free. \$40 / \$100 each, though the first three purchases are free.

- PR: You always know how to shut down trolling without feeding into it, as well as how to defend your brand against slander.
- Performing: You are trained in the more conventional aspects of idol culture, namely singing and dancing. You can sing all night without losing your voice, and dance for hours before feeling tired.
- Streaming: You prepared for the more practical aspects of streaming. Technical difficulties are almost never your fault, and you can figure out someone's IT issues with even a terrible explanation of the problem.
- Networking: There are few VTubers who can be wholly independent. You have a talent for meeting new people and for convincing streamers to form relationships with you, allowing you to regularly collab.
- Branding: What's the point of fame without pay? You have a talent for the logistics and negotiations behind brand deals and merch production, as well as how to maintain your reputation with those connections.
- Voicework: The Streamable Voice perk on steroids. Your voice is not only soothing, but you have the ability to trigger an autonomous sensory meridian response even in those who normally can't experience it.
- Gaming: The bread and butter of streaming. You have mastered the art of commentating over video games and can make even the most bloated games a joy to watch. You are an absolute master at one genre of game.
- Creative: You are exceptionally talented and knowledgeable in one creative pursuit, such as drawing or cooking. You can just impress others with your works or even teach others how to improve their own skills.
- Vibes: You are a beacon for good vibes. Whether they're in your voice call or watching from another state, the way you carry yourself makes others feel like this is a safe place, and everything will turn out fine.

Immovable: For more prolific streamers, the greatest challenge is finding new ways to fill time, but not for you. You are a god of stalling. Whether it's owning up to a bet you lost or just walking 5 feet forward in a game, you can stretch even the most basic commitments for hours, with minimal viewer loss. ¥100

Boys Make the Best Girls: Who says only female streamers make it big? Your gender isn't as much of an impediment for you as it is for others in terms of gaining viewers. If you have sufficiently feminine traits, then you'll gain all the social benefits of being female, even if your biology or voice is male. ¥100

Hard Work Works: More work goes into a streaming career than many realize. At the very least, you don't have to worry about being underappreciated. Your fans have this intuitive ability to understand just how hard you work and can often sense and appreciate when you deserve a break before even you do. ¥100

React Andy: At the end of the day, a streamer's livelihood is how entertaining they are to watch. People are oddly interested in seeing your reactions. There's just something in how you express yourself. Whether it be opinions on recent drama, or just funny videos. You have a bright future as a react streamer. ¥100

Not Very Slappy: There's merit in being the internet's punching bag. There's just something about you that makes you a perfect target for mild teasing. Running gags at your expense takes years for people to even start getting sick of them. Luckily this doesn't impact truly malicious bullying. ¥100

Seiso Streamer: You have the ability to subtly attract or repel lewdness to yourself. Choose to attract, and you'll find more 18+ art of your model and will have an easier time collabing with lewdtubers. Choose to repel, and any who try to bring lewdness into your stream will be relentlessly shamed by chat. ¥100

Keep it PG: Your streams are to be enjoyed by people of all ages. As such, you find that your general charm receives a small but cumulative boost the longer you go without profanities. When you do finally slip up, it's always treated as an event, and a prime instance of gap moe, though the boost will reset afterwards. ¥100

Curse of Comedy: It's been said that every VTuber is half idol and half comedian. Not only is your own comedic timing well honed, but it has a way of infecting others. Even those with no performance experience will find their improvisation and comedy abilities raised for as long as they're interacting with you. ¥100





Hi Honey: A good meme is a lot like a bad cold, and you're patient zero. A combination of creativity and dumb luck allows you to easily set trends. Even a simple slip-of-the-tongue can live on as running jokes even in other people's streams, and when a game catches your interest, suddenly countless other VTubers become just as obsessed with it. ¥200

Fact of the Day: Like a certain AI, when speaking complete nonsense, your words are interpreted in the most beneficial way possible. You can even use

this to backpedal out of toxicity. That sexism was just a Freudian slip, and you weren't trying to gaslight, just a little confused on the facts, right? \(\frac{1}{2}\)200

I'm Hornyl: When it comes to you, everyone is ambiguously bisexual. This won't overcome reluctance for reasons unrelated to gender, but you can successfully flirt with anyone of any sexual orientation, and they'll at least temporarily forget any repulsion they once held towards the concept. ¥200

Open Book: Some streamers are more open about their personal life than others. Your followers are rarely bothered by your private life bleeding into your public image. Brag about your kids all you want, or openly advertise your NSFW side-job, you could even date another public figure with negligible blowback from either of your communities. ¥200





Loli God: Things like "age" are a bit more fluid for you than most. You can freely decide your outward age only upon entering a jump but can change your age in the eyes of the law or society at will. All identification and memories of you in that world will be slightly tweaked to support your stated age. ¥200

Maji Tenshi: If only angels, demons, and the like could be this chill in other worlds. Despite all logic, you'll find your nature, race, or species has a negligible impact on your ability to get along with others. A demon could hang out with all but the prudish angels, while a regular human could chat with gods as equals. ¥200

Specialization Specialist: Many streamers just go with whatever is currently popular, but some take the risk to specialize. Not only does specializing increase your ability to entertain through that specialty, but you can always find a large audience no matter how niche your focus may be. ¥200

GodTuber: Sometimes it takes an anime girl to share God's love. Even in the most toxic environments or communities, you have a skill for creating a safe space where people can feel at ease. You also have a talent for getting across the positive aspects of religion, even to the most stubborn skeptics. ¥200

Poorly Calibrated: Certain VTuber avatars are less... stable, than others. Your body parts can be made to ignore your usual range of motion and clip through each other to occupy the same space. You can take a moment to "recalibrate" your model to fix any such contortions or other damage to your skeleton. ¥300

Schröddiner's Plug: In this world the divide between "fashion" and "biology" becomes ambiguous. You can transform fake animal parts, like a cat ear headband or clip-on tail, into organic (but otherwise mundane) parts of your body. You can also do the opposite for any such parts your body already has. ¥300

Power of Love: The power of love is great indeed. You are able to focus the love of fans as an energy with healing properties towards its focus. This can slow down and potentially cure fatal illnesses. Though such a miracle requires years of attention from millions of fans. ¥300



Whaler: A scary but practical ability. You have an aura that makes your fans easily lose sight of how much they're spending. You can use this subtly to make more people willing to donate or crank all the way up to quickly line your pockets without any regard to your supporters' financial wellbeing. ¥300

Abnormally Normal: Discrimination comes across as a bit silly in a world like this. Similarly, no matter how ridiculous, extreme, or downright impossible your fashion or biology is, as long as you don't pose an obvious threat, people of any world will treat your appearance as completely normal. ¥300



Hibernation: Consistent content is ideal, but sometimes life gets in the way. However, prolonged hiatuses have a negligible effect on your ability to maintain your following. You could vanish for months and come back like nothing happened. Just make sure you don't try to go a full year without any word. ¥300

Multi-Medium: You have a talent for meeting up with and forming bonds with minor celebrities. You also have an easier time selling them on the importance of a certain altruistic cause, like a specific disease or social issue, compelling them to use their resources to further funding and support for it. ¥300

Accursed One: By acting deliberately repulsive, you have an odd effect of making viewers conflate it with a more positive form of exhilaration. Gather enough energy from the repulsion focused on you, and you can create videos that induce horrific (but harmless) hallucinations in viewers. ¥300

Teary-Eyed: The existence of reality TV and terrible apology videos have allowed most people to develop a resistance to tears shed through a screen, but not for you. Your expressions of sadness and sorrow are so palpable that even complete strangers can be touched by your pleas. Even skeptics are slow to question a sob story you put forward until evidence against it is revealed. ¥100

"A": As they say, you only get one chance to make a first impression, but you have nothing to worry about. You are an absolute master at putting your best foot forward. When introducing yourself to a new community, you're always on your A-game. Your mastery of comedic timing and presentation can make you a household name with a single word, if not a single syllable. ¥100

Prime Cut: An agency is nothing without their talents, and you have a way of reminding them of that. Entertainment companies you join have a tendency to recognize you not just as a product, but as a person. You're far less likely to get trapped in exploitative contracts, and there aren't as many hard feelings if you switch to a new employer. This can't bypass total sociopathy. ¥100



Trend Setter: Your success in a field has a way of paving the way for those who follow. Whether it's due to possessing a gender, species, social group, etc. that historically hasn't had much success in a given field, as soon as you've set precedent, others in that group will suddenly face far less resistance to excelling in those same fields. ¥200

Hush-Hush: Maintaining a clean image isn't always a clean process. When you want something to be kept secret, it stays a secret. This is less effective the more indirect your relationship with someone is, but for direct employees, you could keep them silent about something even to the point it ruins one of their personal relationships. ¥200

Star Power: Are employers supposed to be this spineless? You have far more sway in your company than you really should. Whether it's strong-arming them to pay for amenities for you and other streamers, or just berating them to their face on-stream, as long as it can be justified as helping the business, you'll get a pass. \u2206

Anchor: A number of agencies have learned the hard way that a VTuber is more than their model. You are irreplaceable. Your fans know it, and so do your employers. Everyone intuitively knows that attempting to replace you will be seen as a step down and result in a huge loss to viewership, even if the switch happens in total secrecy. ¥400

Parasite Prone: The term "parasocial" has become a bit of a curse, but where there is high risk, there is high reward. You are able to maximize the parasocial aspects of any relationship. While you may eventually delude fans enough to truly think of you as their wife, the consequences of letting down these expectations could be disastrous. ¥400

Patient Zero: Why should VTubing stay behind in this world? You are able to effortlessly spread VTubers as a phenomenon to future worlds. Of course, in some worlds you'll need to either build up the network infrastructure yourself, or find some low-tech equivalent to VTubing, but you will receive credit as the original VTuber. ¥400



Family Matters: In every world, you'll find your relationships with any family members to be overwhelmingly positive. Your chemistry is so great that your fans will absolutely adore it whenever you let your family members cameo with you. As a bonus, your family members will share your unnatural physical characteristics, like multicolor hair or animal ears, though not powers. ¥600

Everybody's Oshi: Out of all your peers, you have a way of standing out. No matter how much they distinguish themselves, you always overtake them in popularity with hardly any effort. You need to have some direct affiliation with someone to be considered their "peer". Outperforming someone somehow never engenders hard feelings, unless you make a point to rub it in. ¥600

Clean Break: Not everyone who graduates is truly ready to give up the streamer life. Once per jump, you are able to assume a completely new identity, complete with a new avatar. Inexplicably, your old fanbase has a way of finding their way back to you, while the negative attention you garnered will lose your trail completely. Perfect for going independent or escaping drama. ¥600

Dead Dreams: You've found that the secret to bringing out a talent's charm is to let them be themselves, whatever form that may take. Let them pick fights, let them scream their fetishes from the rooftops, let them retweet as much porn as they want. In short, more freedom for your talents invariably leads to more popularity. Only applies to entertainers, not desk workers. ¥100

Star Catcher: Every agency has to start somewhere. It helps to have a master of hype like you on-call. Building hype and notoriety is effortless for you. You could have people pissing themselves in excitement for an Agency that hasn't even debuted anyone yet. Once you have made a name, you can manage your image and social media presence to raise your reputation at record speed. ¥100

Just this Once?: Ah, copyright, the true enemy of all content makers. But you have a trick for quelling this savage beast, asking very, very nicely. By humbling yourself and publicly begging, you can pressure even the most greedy and stubborn companies to give you a pass on copyright infringement. The worse the infringement, the more humility you need to express. ¥100



All-Seeing Eye: A power that would make any clipper jealous. You are able to distort spacetime exclusively to watch live streams. You could give your full attention to every stream from every streamer you follow, even those that overlap, while barely cutting into your free time. Only works on live streams or recordings of live streams. ¥200

The Cure: You have all the skills of an indie game studio in one body. You can throw together legitimately fun games in weeks, and fully polished products in months. Fan products you make tend to accumulate immediate fame in fans of the works you're referencing, and sometimes the attention of your inspirations themselves. ¥200

Proud Parent: Whenever you play a vital role in someone's current life or success, they will come to see you as a true parental figure. Their "Mama" or "Papa", if you will. Somehow, this doesn't become awkward if their actual parents are still around. The bond becomes less extreme once someone else takes over your role in their life, but still present. ¥200

Dotted Line: This can manifest in one of two ways. The first is a skill for trapping talents in horribly exploitative contracts that milk them for all they're worth with no retort. The other allows you to make a true talent-first approach, where you can run your company to treat its employees with leniency and respect while still managing to make a profit. ¥400

Detritivore: You know an unpolished gem when you see one. Even if it's potential as a star is hidden, it can't escape your eyes. In addition, for those who fell from grace due to some drama or controversy, you can tell when their drive to entertain still burns, and you can take them under your management and rehabilitate their image with relative ease. ¥400

Slapstick: You are able to enchant an area up to the size of a building to essentially function under toon force. Reality acts according to what would be funny, rather than make sense, and any harm caused by this is temporary. These effects can't reach outside this domain, even indirectly. Doesn't affect those with truly malicious intent. \(\frac{1}{2}400\)



Daddy? Sorry!: Like a certain turtle, you have the skill to create artificial VTubers. While they may not be as... coherent as other VTubers, their lack of sense is precisely their charm. You can even figure out how to modify attributes on the fly, like sanity or evilness. Any of these AI's can be inserted into android bodies, or avatars created through the Step Mommy perk. ¥600

Knock-On Effect: You do your best to help other VTubers shine, what's wrong with keeping a little of the spotlight for yourself? You'll find that your own popularity increases proportionally to all those you've supported to get this far. Suddenly the plain-looking manager is as much a fan-favorite as the talent, and the distant CEO is universally dubbed "best girl" by the community. ¥600

Step Mommy: Through an extensive expenditure of time and psychic energy, you can use your artistic skill to craft VTuber avatars, accessories, and modifications for others. This can even be used on non-companions, but if you aren't willing to spend the psychic energy you gathered, you'll need some kind of sufficiently abstract substitute. ¥600, Requires Mommy? Sorry! (Upgraded)





Private Militia: There's a difference between "independent" and "isolated". You have an almost magnetic attraction towards the types who would be willing to moderate your stream and discord for free. Even if you only just started, you'll have at least a handful of volunteers eager to show their worth. You can even short-change conventionally paid positions like editors. ¥100

Dynamite Cute: Neurotypicality is overrated. You'll find any neural or social disorders, disabilities, injuries, etc. will universally manifest in the cutest ways possible. A slight speech impediment, a tendency to hyper-fixate, a complete lack of an attention span, even just speaking English/Japanese as a second language. Any and all of it will just contribute to your charm. ¥100

Flashbang: Aren't you the liveliest little dynamo? You rarely find yourself lacking in energy. Your stamina is immense, but not literally infinite, but with how you can keep up your lively disposition even when physically exhausted, it can seem that way at times. Compounding this is your natural athleticism and ability to stay up late with a negligible impact on your health. ¥100



Have Confidence!: By verbally expressing your confidence in something you're attempting, you are able to jinx yourself in such a way that you are guaranteed to fail in a manner that is both hilarious and humiliating, even if you have perks that should make such blunders impossible. You can toggle this off so you can boast as normal. ¥200

Reach for the Stars: What more could a streamer want than to inspire others? By singling someone out as an inspiration, you will find it infinitely easier to enter into the same field. Even the most tenuous relationship with them, such as moderating their chat or drawing channel art for them, will give you a massive head start in building a community. ¥200

Who's Candice?: There's no way you're actually this innocent. Your brain is able to censor its own contents from you, such as censoring cynicism to make you appear incorruptible, or adorably gullible. This can be applied manually, disabled, or set to automatically censor anything that could negatively impact your image, directly or indirectly. ¥200

Friend of the Algorithm: A mighty boon indeed. You seem to have the love of algorithms, specifically those responsible for recommending your videos far and wide. Even people who aren't interested in VTubers will find your clips recommended to them, specifically those that appeal to their interests. ¥400

A Rare Treat: Like VTubers, Jumpers are known to take on many faces. You will find that the emotional impact of any form you don will skyrocket proportionally to how long you go between uses. After a week of disuse, that kaiju form is pretty cool, but after a year, onlookers will be practically paralyzed with awe when you bust it out. ¥400

Collab Hunter: Collaborations are the bread and butter of VTubers. You have an almost scary talent for forming genuine friendships for those you collaborate with, even briefly. You also have an easy time convincing these connections to clear their schedule to join you for extremely silly events, like a condiment tier list or R<sub>34</sub> game show. ¥400



Double or Nothing: For some reason, being near you causes people to overflow with unwarranted confidence. Let this bloat enough, and you can convince people to agree to just about anything as a dare or bet. Whether it's wasting hundreds of dollars, publicly humiliating themselves, or waxing off their eyebrows, not even the flakiest of gamblers will be able to back down. ¥600

Mitosis: You are able to split yourself into a maximum of 4 bodies. These aren't technically clones, as you're dividing aspects of yourself into separate beings, and whatever skills or abilities you give one, the others will lack. They project an aura of "incompleteness" that runs a high risk of making you hemorrhage viewers. You won't be able to recombine until the start of the next jump. ¥600

Kaleidoscopic Lore: People will commonly build lore around you that often crosses over with other important figures. Is any of this true? Well if it spreads far enough, even those directly involved may just run with it. This can even be applied to individual forms, to the point you can have an equally impressive reputation attached to each one, even if they clearly contradict. ¥600





All perks 50% off and one 100¥ perk free for Anti VTubers.

Hypothetically Speaking: You are a practically infinite repository of unwanted knowledge. Controversial opinions? One for every occasion! Disgusting trivia? Only the grossest! Conspiracy theories? Enough to send even the most upbeat streamers into an existential crisis! No matter the situation, you always seem to know what to say to bring down everyone's mood. ¥100

Slippery Snake: Ban evading is a serious offense... unless you get away with it. Bans don't hit you nearly as frequently as they should. Even when they finally hit their mark, common ban-evading tactics that most would get caught doing you are almost 100x more likely to get away with. You can stir up shit to your heart's content, as long as you don't do anything that's actually illegal. ¥100

Sheep's Clothing: You'd be surprised how many people call themselves "VTubers" on twitter despite showing no signs of ever debuting. Similarly, you are able to claim to belong to a certain fad or movement while barely meeting any of the qualifications of being so. You can say whatever outlandish shit on the topic, and most people will assume you're speaking from experience. ¥100



Fisherman: Stirring shit online is a lot like fishing. All it takes is some patience, and the right bait. Whether it's tricking streamers into obvious setups, starting dumb arguments with a single sentence, or knowing just how to make your video thumbnail as misleading as possible, you always seem to know the right bait for the right occasion. ¥200

Shitposter Supreme: Trolling is an artform, and you are a master of your craft. You know all the tactics to keep even the inanist argument going for hours. Accompanying this is a kind of toxic charisma that gives people the delusion that no matter how much you shit on them, they'll manage to "win" the argument eventually. ¥200

I am Inside Your Walls: This isn't trolling anymore. Now you're just a criminal. You know all the tricks to doxing somebody's private information. As an added effect, revealing this information invariably brings hate and potentially threats towards the person you've exposed, even if these people aren't entirely sure what they're mad about. ¥200

True For Thee but not for Me: Rules were made to be broken, by you, that is. You tend to get away scott-free for minor contractual infractions. On the flip side, people you don't like are cursed to get harsh punishments from even the slightest offenses, up to and including forced graduation. Naturally, this leeway only reaches so far. ¥400

Sticks and Stones: It's truly pathetic how much damage a few mean words can cause. When you insult someone online, even anonymously, it'll hit them emotionally as if their loved ones were saying it to their face with total conviction. For the record, this doesn't work face-to-face. There must be some level of separation between you and the target. ¥400

Source - Trust Me: Who needs evidence when you're the loudest voice in the room? As long as you aren't framing someone for a crime that actually happened, you are never asked to back up your accusations against someone. In most cases, the more they try to point out your lack of evidence, the more guilty they end up looking. ¥400



Rage of a Nation: The deadliest weapon in an anti's arsenal. With even the slightest pretense, you can turn the hatred of an entire nationality against a single person or group. A few of an agency's talents mentioned Taiwan? They will be China's enemy forever. An indie VTuber Made a 9-11 joke? Clearly they must be prevented from ever showing their face in the USA. Etc. ¥600

Poisoned Well: Anyone who thinks they can stop you will be going down with you. It's not clear how you do this, but anyone who exposes your misdeeds or crimes will have their own relationships permanently ruined in the process. Exposing a serial doxer will turn all the doxed VTubers against them, exposing a groomer may have them called a groomer instead, and so on. ¥600

Unforgiven: Once per jump, you may select a single individual to curse. Once placed, this curse will make it so the internet will not forgive them, for anything, ever. Every edgy joke, every slip of the tongue, every ignorant comment, it will be held against them until they either fall off the face of the internet, or assume a totally new identity. ¥600





Background companions are half-off for their associated origin and can be imported.



Mascot: A small sidekick to keep you company as you stream. They can be anything from a small demon to a lion and tempura shrimp hybrid. Your chat can pay for their messages to come through this small being's mouth. ¥50

Gen-Mates: You may import an old companion or create an OC companion. They receive ¥600 to spend as they please. It's your call whether they're related to you in some way, such as being your manager or part of the same generation under the same agency, or just doing their own thing. The number of companions doubles with each purchase, up to a maximum of 8. ¥50 - ¥200

Crossover: You receive a slot that may be used to take a pre-existing VTuber within this world as a companion, as long as you gain their informed consent. If you can't convince the VTuber you had in mind, you get to hold onto the slot and can try again with another VTuber. The number of slots doubles with each purchase, up to a maximum of 8. \$50 - \$200

Followers: Many VTubers can manifest their followers as a massive (though admittedly weak) army of minions, loosely based on their theme (shrimp for a shark VTuber, skeletons for a reaper VTuber, etc.). They share one companion slot, and their numbers rise and fall proportionally to your fame. ¥200

Manager (Corpo): The type of manager that any talent would envy. They have infinite patience for all the tedious logistics behind the entertainment industry. Best of all, they always seem to take your side against higher-ups, and will fight tooth-and-nail to get approval on ideas you put forward. ¥100

Talent (Support): Every agency has to start somewhere. This aspiring VTuber is inexperienced, but with a little polish can become a household name in the scene. Neither of you will realize right away how much untapped talent they possess; it'll just take some experimenting to realize what form it takes. ¥100

Clipper (Indie): The true secret ingredient to VTuber fame. A particularly motivated channel has taken such a liking to you that they watch all your streams and have a scary talent for clipping all your best moments the day they happen. They'll be invaluable for getting your name out there. ¥100

Enabler (Anti): Doesn't everyone deserve a friend? This VTuber has had a great deal of personal success in their own right, but no matter how bad your reputation becomes, their faith in you is unshakable. They'll always take your side in drama and encourage all their fans to do the same. ¥100



# Streaming Equipment

One ¥50 item free, one ¥100, ¥200, ¥400, & ¥600 item half-off.

Necessities: The bare minimum you'll need for a streaming career. A microphone, camera, chair, headphones, and so on. No matter how extreme your biology or environment, this equipment can be used without issue. ¥0

The Vessel: Through some memetic property, any who sees this mason jar will assume it implies something lewd, even if they aren't sure what. It can also grow large enough for you to fit inside it. Otherwise, it's a normal glass jar. ¥50

Box Sweet Box: Rent is expensive, this works just fine. You are in possession of the most comfortable cardboard box ever. It is unaffected by water, fire, or temperature, and somehow has enough room for your streaming setup.¥50



Asajumper: A large fake tail attached via anal plug. Through some unknown magic or science, it will transform into an actual tail you can control upon insertion and can be removed just as easily. It also seems to phase through clothing. Comes in a length and design of your choosing. ¥50 / ¥0 With Schröddiner's Plug

Jumpercure: An extremely motivated indie game developer has started creating games that honor your powers, companions, and past adventures. They'll only publish them with your permission, but they're all quite well made. ¥100

Zootiphenidate: These pills come with an official prescription in every jump and have the effect of inducing the most adorable high imaginable. They can absorb the properties of mundane medicine by adding them to the bottle. ¥100

Omni-Block: You possess what might be the most perfect AdBlock ever. It temporarily installs itself on any device you use, is undetectable, and works on any kind of advertisement, even if that shouldn't be possible. ¥100

Universal Visa: Perfect for that special someone who happens to live across the globe. This visa has no expiration date and works in any country. Anybody you marry will automatically receive a universal visa of their own. \(\frac{1}{2}\)200

Next Meme: You are in possession of a Discord channel filled with your loving fans. It moderates itself, and through some unknown property, you never have trouble maintaining meaningful bonds with every person who joins. \(\frac{1}{2}\)200

The Big Leagues: It's easy to forget that VTubers are a type of idol. You are able to summon a colossal stage out of thin air once a week. It has all the special effects and mechanisms you could expect, along with invisible cameras. You can control all of it with just your will. ¥200





Peerage: You aren't just an elite; you are the quintessential elite. All official documentation of you will identify you as some kind of noble or royalty, and other nobles will know your name and accept you as an equal, even if you are unable to produce any tangible proof that your kingdom actually exists. ¥400

V-Jumper: Your own personal VTuber Agency. This agency will follow you between worlds, but non-companion talents will not. Still, even if you do nothing this will naturally attract unpolished talents overnight, who will see their own skills develop twice as fast as they would otherwise. ¥400

A Pirate's Dream: Who says streamers never go outside? You are the owner of some large vessel. It could be a large pirate-ship, a private jet, a castle-sized tank, etc. It automatically repairs and restocks any consumed supplies. You must pay a plus-charge if this vessel is spacefaring. ¥400 / ¥600

Side Gig: It's unrealistic to try and pay the bills with just streaming. You are the owner of an extremely profitable non-entertainment-based company. Perhaps you harvest oil or produce munitions. Whatever it is, you can live in luxury without needing to lift a finger ever again. ¥600

Twotch: Streaming isn't as developed in other worlds as this one. However, as long as you can produce something even vaguely resembling an internet, you have your own personal streaming platform you can deploy onto it. Its policies are all up to you, but it'll always manage to gain some level of popularity. ¥600

Jumpopolis: Cities in this world need to be tough. You are the mayor of a small city/kingdom/etc. with the property of preventing any deaths and instantly repairing any damage caused without malice. Knock over a building and the most you'll get are some nasty insults from the annoyed workers within. ¥600





No drawback cap for Jumper. Companions may gain up to ¥600.

Past Life: Most VTuber communities can respect their streamer's desires to keep the past in the past. Yours, on the other hand, do not. Many of your fans will take any opportunity to derail topics to talk about your past. Thankfully, you don't have anything that dark to hide. It's mainly just annoying. +¥50

Hatedom: There are few streamers without some haters, yours stand out in that you aren't entirely sure what they're mad about, as any explanation they give is completely incomprehensible. Hate views are still views, and they are fairly consistent, but they may still scare off a few potential fans. +¥50

Back in the Barnyard: A particular piece of fetish content seems to have gained legs and run away from you. You've become associated with some grotesque or controversial act like bestiality or coprophilia through no fault of your own. It's your choice whether you lean into the bit or try your best to ignore it. +¥50

Free Space: Whether through carelessness or artistic license, some part of your avatar will become a point of frequent bullying. An oversized forehead, a flat chest, a weird nose, etc. It'll be fun and games at first, but this patience will drain as you realize your fans refuse to get sick of the same tired jokes. +¥50



Second Fiddle: Another VTuber debuted at the same time as you and has been stealing your thunder ever since. They attract fans with a fraction of the effort, and their events always overlap with yours. The worst part is, this all really is pure coincidence, so you can't call attention to it without seeming petty. +¥100

Scuff Streamer: It's a miracle you even know what "live streaming" is. You and technical difficulties are inseparable. Starting a stream without something breaking is an event, and you often have to harass your friends and family to solve issues that, when resolved, turn out to be embarrassingly mundane. +¥100

Watch This: It's scary what streamers will do for fame. You've hooked up a system that gives chat the ability to pay for random objects to pelt you out of nowhere, even off-stream. They don't hurt as much as you'd think, but a few seconds of consistent impacts will cause you to fall down without fail. +¥100

Jumper is my Girlfriend: The degree that other people lust over you is inversely proportional to how much you'd want it. Pride yourself as a seiso streamer, and chat will be full of horn dogs. Blast your sex appeal at every chance, and chat will consistently sandbag you and rub in just how unwanted you are. +¥100

Exposed: This could be considered the worst-case scenario for any streamer. Whether out of hate, misguided love, or indiscriminate sadism, your private information getting doxed is an unfortunately common occurrence for you. Even if you move, your new address will be public within the month.  $\pm 4$ 

Rotten Idol: Some streamers fit the "idol" mold better than others, but you do know a thing or two about other kinds of mold. You are a slob, surrounding yourself in trash and refusing to do the bare minimum self-care. Your BO is foul, and you can't manage a single pushup without getting winded. +¥200

Black Company: Whether a manager from your agency or a distant acquaintance looking to "help" your career. You're contractually obliged to stream for unhealthy hours for negligible pay. Any actions that would break your contract or damage your employer's image will invariably trigger life-ruining fines. +¥200

Turkish Delight: Due to various factors, Japanese or English-speaking VTubers have an advantage over all other languages in visibility. You, unfortunately, are only able to speak a far less universal language like Turkish or Mudbura. You will find it impossible to learn or speak any other language. +¥200



Physhera: You suffer from some debilitating condition that makes it impossible to live a normal life. Compromised immune system, weak muscles, breathing issues, the whole package. The medicine and treatment needed to keep your condition from worsening will siphon the vast majority of your income. +¥300

Unicorn Hunter: Any community you build is plagued with dreaded "unicorns". These fans feel so entitled to their idealized image of you that they'll attempt to ruin the lives of anyone who gets too friendly with you and may try to do the same to you if you push back on them too hard.  $\pm 300$ 



Dead Weight: For unclear reasons, you will fail to achieve any notable success in your solo pursuits. The only time you experience any growth is during collabs with bigger VTubers. While this isn't inherently bad, people will eventually catch on to your over-reliance on others to further your own career. +¥300

Not-so-Virtual Youtubers: Only a total bore would take this. Forget everything said before. You're being sent to a completely mundane Earth, where VTubers here really are just virtual avatars. You won't be able to manifest any of your special items or abilities from this or any jump outside of toggles for your avatar.. +¥300


Taiwan Approved: Through some seemingly minor taboo you were oblivious to, you've earned the hatred of a major nation's people. These people are without number and see no evil as too great to ruin you. Should you infuriate them further, their government may start pulling strings to punish you. +¥400

A Normal Human Being: There is an anomaly in this world. A VTuber who is able and willing to use their power for evil, and they seek your end. Their full power is unknown, but nothing has ever successfully harmed them. They are a monster, they are a dark god, they are the art student Suzuhara Lulu. +¥400



One Strike, You're Out: Streaming platforms aren't exactly known for their fairness, and you'll find their incompetence towards you is overclocked. False strikes, random bans, the works. Should you find yourself banned from every platform you stream on, even briefly, it'll mean the end of your chain. +¥400

You Laugh, You Lose: This seemed like such a good idea when you signed that contract, but now you aren't so sure. From the instant this jump starts to its end, the act of either laughing, cursing, or cringing are forbidden, and will instantly result in chainfail. No matter how clearly you explain the severity of this, your chain can't seem to resist trying to make you break your streak by any means. You only need to pick one of the three for \(\frac{1}{2}\)400, but the other two can be added to the challenge for \(\frac{1}{2}\)100 each.  $(-1)^2$ 400 /  $(-1)^2$ 400



#### Graduation (Go Home)

You've lost your taste for this hobby, or you've just had your fill of the Jumper lifestyle. You've chosen to bring your chain to an end and return home to your original life.

#### Uncancellable (Stay Here)

You've got a lifetime of passion for streaming left in you, or just can't leave your new friends behind. You've decided to end your chain early and spend the rest of your days here.

## New Contract (Move On)

It's been fun, but it's about time to try something new. You'll be packing up your things here and moving on to share the joy of VTubing with the rest of the multiverse. Unless you're just sick of the whole concept, of course.

### Fate of Your Channel (Bonus)

If you managed to stream regularly for the entirety of your time here (at least weekly), you will be able to transfer your channel into any future worlds with the technology or magic to sustain such a thing. Somehow, even your viewers from past Jumps are still able to tune into your stream. Any attempts to explain how that even works will result in an immediate ban.

#### Context:

I don't doubt there are plenty of potential perks, items, etc. that didn't occur to me, but it isn't realistic to try and create a jump that perfectly represents every individual's experience with VTubers, so naturally the jump is skewed towards the VTubers I've personally watched. Luckily that's still a decent sample size.

You'll have to take my word that this jump isn't one needlessly elaborate jab at the guy who was talking about making their own Generic VTuber jump. I've had plans to make this for a while, that was just the last push I needed to go through with it. Besides, if they didn't give me the excuse to narrow the scope of the jump to purely slice of life elements, this probably wouldn't have gotten made, since I'd still be trying to cover absolutely everything in this one jump.

It's your choice whether you stream on Twitch, YouTube, or anywhere else.
